The Month of ELUL

The month of Elul: A month before Rosh Hashanah, this year Friday, August 21, we begin preparing for the Day of Judgment. We blow the shofar each weekday morning, with the exception of *Erev* Rosh Hashanah, and add Psalm 27 into our prayers each morning and evening, in order to begin awakening within us feelings of repentance.

Selichot: Penitential prayers are recited each weekday morning until Yom Kippur. We begin reciting these prayers at a special midnight service on Saturday night, September 12.

From the Rabbi

We are in a period of time called "*bein hametzarim*," which begins on the 17th of Tammuz and ends on *Tisha B'Av*. Both are fast days, the former extending from dawn to dusk and the latter beginning in the evening and lasting through the next evening (see details on the section of the laws and customs in this ChaiLine issue). These two days express the many afflictions and calamities that befell Israel during the sad times in our history. The dates of these days correspond to the times in which the events occurred, and are associated specifically with most hurtful episodes to the Jewish Nation – the destructions of our two temples.

Therefore during these three weeks of sorrow we refrain from celebrations such as weddings, bar mitzvahs, and other joyous festivities. This is so that we can awaken our hearts to be better Jews and contemplate our deeds. In this way we can truly do *teshuvah* (repentance) and ask for forgiveness for our sins, which caused these tragedies, as our prophet says, "*And they shall confess their iniquity, and the iniquity of their fathers*" (Lev.26:40). We should at least fast and confess our sins, just as the people of Ninveh did, so that Hashem will forgive us, as is written in the book of Jonah, "*And G-d saw their deed, in that they turned from their evil way, and G-d repented of the evil which he had said that he would do to them, and he did not do it*" (3:10). From here we see that fasting is the preparation for *teshuvah*, and we must take this first step towards repentance.

May G-d accept our *teshuvah* and answer our prayers to bring the redemption speedily.

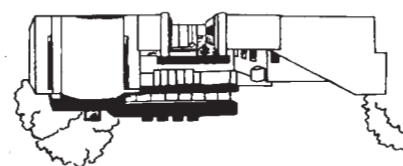
