## *Maot Chitim* – Passover Charity

We all know how expensive it is to purchase all our Pesach foods and needs. We cannot forget that we have an obligation to help those less economically able to do their own purchases and enjoy the Seder and the holiday. This special charity to provide for Jewish poor the ability to purchase Pesach provisions is called Maot Chitim.

Beth David and Jewish Family Service are working together to provide for the needs of local poor and the poor in Israel. In order to assure that the money is available to enable the poor to shop before Pesach, we ask that you send your check no later than March 25. Checks may be made payable to Beth David Synagogue Rabbi's Discretionary Fund or to Jewish Family Service, noting that it is for Passover Charity and if you wish to designate your gift to local or Israeli poor. Checks may be mailed to the office of either organization. Contributions received after March 25 will be distributed in Israel.

## Authorization to sell Chametz

The undersigned hereby authorizes, empowers and directs Rabbi Zev Silber, or any other person authorized or empowered by him, to act in my place and stead and on my behalf to sell all chametz possessed by me, whether knowingly or unknowingly, whether presently in my possession or in anyone else's possession. Such chametz, as defined by the Torah and Rabbinic law shall include actual chametz, mixtures of chametz, and chametz that has adhered to or become absorbed into the surfaces of pots, pans and other utensils. This general authorization shall apply to any chametz owned by me or in my possession wherever so located, including, but not limited to, that chametz situated at:

(address of house, store, office, etc.)

and located in the following places:

(Specify place(s) where chametz is being stored e.g. sealed kitchen cupboards)

The undersigned hereby further empowers Rabbi Zev Silber to lease all places upon which such chametz is situated and to lease or sell on my behalf any and all pots, pans, and utensils which contain chametz.

Rabbi Zev Silber is hereby authorized and directed by me to enter into any other type of transaction on my behalf with respect to such chametz on any such terms and for such period of time as he deems fit. I hereby confirm the validity of such transactions as if same were entered into by me directly.

If this document is being signed by more than one person, all necessary changes to the language of this authorization shall be deemed to have been made.

### Vegetarian Casserole

2 cups onions chopped
3 cups shredded carrots
1 cup chopped celery
2/3 cup olive oil
3 teaspoons salt
1/2 teaspoon pepper

2 pkg. frozen broccoli or spinach thawed

(if using spinach drain)

Sauté onions, carrots and celery in oil for about 10 minutes. Mix eggs with broccoli, sautéed vegetables and matzo meal, add salt and pepper. Bake in a round or rectangle glass dish at 350 degrees for 45 minutes to 1 hour. Cover for the first 35 minutes then uncover for remaining time. Edges should be nice and brown.
